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#### Introduction

The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (ACA), signed into law March 23, 2010, requires hospitals with a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status to meet requirements to comply with the intent of a charitable hospital. The final rule was issued by the U.S. Department of the Treasury on December 29, 2014, regarding the charitable hospital requirements included in the ACA.

Under the final rule, organizations with a 501(c)(3) tax-exempt status that operate at least one hospital must comply with the requirements for charitable hospitals, including:

- ✓ conducting a Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) every 3 years.
- ✓ adopting an implementation strategy to meet the community health needs identified through the CHNA.
- ✓ reporting how it is addressing the needs identified in the CHNA and a description of needs that are not being addressed with explanations of why such needs are not being addressed.

Meade District Hospital operates as a charitable hospital under 501(c)(3) tax exempt status, but is not required to file a Form 990 tax return due to being under that arm of a state or local government entity. However, Meade District Hospital does operate using a 403(b) pension plan for employee benefits; therefore, subject to 501(r) tax regulations and is required to complete a CHNA on a 3-year cycle (MHA, 2019). This community health needs assessment is intended to document Meade District Hospital's (MDH) compliance with IRC Section 501(r). Health needs of the community have been identified and prioritized so that MDH may adopt an implementation strategy to address specific needs of the community it serves.

The Community Health Needs Assessment includes:

- $\checkmark$  A description of the community served by the hospital and how it was determined
- $\checkmark$  A description of the process and methods used to conduct the assessment
- ✓ A description of the approach used to plan, develop and conduct the assessment and prioritize the health issues, detailing how the hospital took into account input from individuals who represent the broad interests of the community served by the hospital facility
- ✓ A prioritized description of all community health needs identified through the CHNA, as well as a description of the process and criteria used in prioritizing such health needs
- ✓ A description of identified data from primary and secondary resources regarding financial and other barriers to access; preventive health gaps; and indicators of nutritional, social, economic, environmental and behavioral health, all of which influence health status
- ✓ A description of the existing health care facilities and other resources within the community available to meet the community health needs identified through the CHNA

The process involved collection and analysis of a large range of data, including demographic, socioeconomic, health statistics, and health care resources. Surveys of key stakeholders who represent a broad interest of the community, populations of need and/or persons with special knowledge of public health.

The 2019 Community Health Needs Assessment focused on the topics of Mental Health, Physical Inactivity, and Adult Obesity. The continuation to meet these needs of the community will be addressed with any new needs identified with the 2022 Community Health Needs Assessment.

In order to identify the current needs of the community, a twenty-two question, community-wide survey was conducted via email, community flyers with QR code, paper distribution to the community senior center, and posting to social media and hospital website. Results from the survey identified the following community health needs:

- Mental Health Needs for Teens and Adults
- Vaping Among Teenagers
- Illegal Substance Abuse
- Obesity in Adults

Further discussion of the assessment will be detailed later in this report.

The CHNA will identify assets and programs Meade District Hospital currently has in place, as well as existing gaps. This project provides an opportunity for Meade District Hospital to incorporate data and community input into the overall strategy to provide better services that result in better health care and lower costs for our community partners.

This document will be made widely available to the public and is a summary of all available evidence collected during the CHNA conducted in the 2022 tax year. It will serve as a compliance document as well as a resource until the next assessment cycle. Both the process and the document serve as the basis for prioritizing the community's health needs and will aid in planning to meet those needs (BKD, 2019).

#### Meade District Hospital: About Us

Located in Meade, Kansas, Meade District Hospital is a 20-bed critical access hospital (CAH) that has been recognized as a Top 100 Critical Access Hospital in 2022. Honored to serve the Southwest Kansas Community, Artesian Valley Health System serves four communities in Southwest Kansas – three of which are in Meade County. The primary medical service area for Meade District Hospital includes zip code areas of Meade, Plains, and Fowler.

The Meade Hospital District was formed in the early 1950s. Over the next 50 years, the original building was remodeled and expanded several times. In November 2000, voters of the Hospital District approved the construction of a new facility. This new building project was completed in 2004, allowing for the availability for more advanced healthcare services to community patrons.

Meade District Hospital assumed operations of three Rural Health Clinics and purchased Lone Tree Retirement Center in 2005. Due to the acquisitions of these entities, the Meade District Hospital Board of Directors and staff explored a name change that encompasses the facilities under one name. Artesian Valley Health System (AVHS) was born, in which the Meade District Hospital is now doing business.



#### About the Community

The CDC (2013) states "communities are typically defined by geographic area; however, they can also be based on shared interests or characteristics such as religion, race, age, or occupation. People within a community come from different backgrounds and have unique cultures, customs, and values". BKD (2019) defined community as "the geographic area from which a significant number of the patients utilizing Hospital services reside". The latter definition is the community identified for this document.

Artesian Valley Health System serves four communities in Southwest Kansas – three of which are in Meade County. The primary medical service area for Meade District Hospital, in Meade County, includes zip code areas of Meade, Plains, and Fowler. BKD (2019) defined the utilization of hospital services as the definition for Community due to Meade District Hospital being the "single largest provider of acute care services" in Meade County.

Figure 1 demonstrates that Meade District Hospital is the only primary medical service facility in Meade County. Surrounding hospitals are identified within the figure along with respective bed count. Figure 2 displays the geographical community for the hospital service areas of Meade (67864), Plains (67869), and Fowler (67844). Southern Gray County, zip code area of Montezuma (67867) can be identified as a secondary service area for Meade District Hospital as Gray County has primary hospital within the county.

#### **Community Population:**

The community's primary medical service area of the cities of Fowler, Meade, and Plains, as indicated by Table 1, experienced a decrease in population of 1.976% from 2010 to 2020, followed by a further estimated decrease from 2020-2021 of 0.488%. The 2020 United States Census identified all of Meade County to have a population decrease of 0.8% from 2020 to 2021 and 11.37% decrease from 2010-2020. Estimates were based on the United States Census Bureau provided by the Institute of Policy & Social Research by the University of Kansas.

#### **Community Population and Demographics:**

It is important to understand the demographic population of Meade County in relation to the medical services that are provided to the community. According to Kansas Health Matters (2022), 5–18-year age group makes up more than a quarter of the population of the Meade County community at 26% (1,045 individuals). A majority of the population is between the ages of 19-64, consisting of 1,939 (48.2%).

When looking at race and ethnicity of the Meade County population, it is important to note the growing population of individuals identifying as Hispanic or Latino origin. In comparison to the state, as a whole, of 12.7%. This data is significant to understand how the delivery of healthcare services may be impacted due to language barriers, and disease processes that may affect the Hispanic population more greatly.

#### **Community Health Factors**

#### Access to Healthy Food

According to Kansas Health Matters (2022), the most recent 'Grocery Store Density' indicator was recorded in 2016. "There are strong correlations between the density of grocery stores in a neighborhood and the nutrition and diet of its residents. The availability and affordability of healthy and varied food options in the community increase the likelihood that residents will have a balanced and nutritious diet. A diet comprised of nutritious foods, in combination with an active lifestyle, can reduce the incidence of heart disease, cancer and diabetes and is essential to maintain a healthy body weight and prevent obesity Low-income and under-served communities often have limited access to stores that sell healthy food, especially high-quality fruits and vegetable. Moreover, rural communities often have a high number of convenience stores, where healthy and fresh foods are less available than in larger, retail food markets" (Kansas Health Matters 2022). There are 2 grocery stores in Meade County. One in the city of Meade and one in the city of Plains. The Plains store opened at the beginning of 2022, providing an additional resource to Meade County. This increased access by 0.27 per 1,000 people from the 2019 Community Health Needs Assessment, allowing more individuals access to a grocery store. Table 8 delineates grocery store access per 1,000 people, broadly for the U.S. and the State of Kansas populations, and local for Meade County in 2016 and 2022.

#### Access to Recreation and Fitness




Figure 7: Access to Exercise Opportunities in Kansas

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (2022), physical activity is vital for healthy aging and reduction of chronic disease burden. Physical activity contributes to people living longer and lessons the risk of health problems such as heart disease, and diabetes (CDC, 2022). There is only one fitness center in Meade County, located in the City of Meade. The Wellness Center is owned by the Meade Recreation Commission. In Meade County, 32% of adults are physically active (County Health Rankings & Roadmaps, 2022). Figure 7 demonstrates how Meade County ranks among the State of Kansas for access to exercise opportunities. Table 9 shows the percent of adults who are physically inactive in Meade County compared to the rest of Kansas and U.S.

#### Access to Primary Care

There are 3 family practice clinics that serve the primary service area -2 in Meade, and 1 in Plains. Table 10 reports the number of primary care physicians per 100,000 population. A primary care physician includes: General Family Medicine MD or DO, General Practice MD and DO, General Internal Medicine MD and General Pediatric MD. Artesian Valley Health System currently has 1 MD on staff that primarily serves the secondary service area in Montezuma. At the time of this report, there is only one private-practice physician that practices within the hospital's primary service community.

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

#### **Preventable Hospital Events**

Figure 8 reports the rate of hospital stays for ambulatory-care sensitive conditions (ACS) per 100,000 Medicare enrollees. Pneumonia, dehydration, asthma, diabetes and other conditions are considered ACS conditions which could have been prevented if adequate primary care resources were available and accessed by those patients. Analysis of this is relevant because ACS discharges allows demonstrating a possible 'return on investment' from interventions that reduce admissions through better access to primary care resources (BKD, 2019).


#### **Social Determinants of Health**

Social determinants of health have a heavy impact on the health and well-being of an individual and the overall community. Healthy People 2030 have established social determinants of health as a priority area. Healthy People 2030 defines social determinants of health as the "conditions in the environment where people are born, live, learn, work, play, worship, and age that affect a wide range of health, functioning, and quality-of-life outcomes and risks" (Healthy People 2030,

n.d). The 5 domains are economic stability, education access and quality, health care access and quality, neighborhood and built environment, and social and community context. Factors such as grocery store access impact the health and well-being of an individual to have access to healthy food options and to decrease the risk of conditions such as heart disease, diabetes and obesity (Healthy People 2030, n.d.). The following snapshots are from Kansas Health Matters for Meade County, Kansas.







#### Survey

#### Methodology:

A twenty-two-question community-wide survey was conducted to better understand the communities view on the overall health of the community, use of Primary Care Provider, barriers to healthcare, concerning and unmet health needs of the community, and determination of health equity. The survey was conducted in both electronic and paper form. A link was sent via email to various community businesses, announced via the company Facebook page with a QR code to access the survey, a link was place on the hospital's website, fliers with the QR code were handed out at a community event and hung at various locations throughout the hospital service area. Paper copies were handed out at the senior center.




Figure 4: Meade County Zip Code Respondents

The survey ran from December 9, 2022 to December 23, 2022. A total of 38 surveys were completed; of those, 37 were electronic. The survey results were presented on December 29, 2022. The largest survey respondents were from the Meade (67864) zip code (see Figure 4 below).



The survey highlighted several health topics for the community to provide feedback. This section discusses those focused areas.

#### **Overall Health of the Community**

Respondents were asked to rank the overall health and quality of life in Meade County. As demonstrated in Figure 5, the majority ranked that Meade County is good or average with 60.5% responding that the overall health in Meade County was average and 29% responded gool. Other responses:

- One (2.6%) responded 'very good'
- 3 (7.9%) responded poor
- 0 (0%) responded 'very poor'.

When asked if the health and quality of life in Meade County has improved, stayed the same, or declined in the past few years, 57.9% stated it stayed the same, 34.2% claimed it has declined, and 7.9% reported improvement. Respondents were asked to explain factors that influence their ranking of the overall health and quality of life in Meade County. Table 4 identifies how Meade County residents recognize the contributing reasons for their survey answer.



#### Use of Primary Care Provider

A majority of respondents stated they see a primary care provider at least annually, those who answered "no" were asked to reasons they do not. Of those who responded to the reason for not seeing a provider on an annual bases, the primary answer given for answering "no" was that they would only go to the doctor when it is needed.

#### **Barriers to Healthcare**

Survey respondents were asked to identify barriers that exist in Meade County that prevent individuals from obtaining better health and quality of life. Respondents could select more than one answer. Figure 6 displays the responses for the survey question. Accessibility to specialists, ability to pay, and cost of health care were the top 3 barriers recognized by the community.

The survey asked for respondents to further identify unmet needs for the community when asked, what health or community services should Meade District Hospital provide that are not currently available?' Responses to the survey questions aligned with what was displayed in Table 6. The majority of responses were need of primary care providers and specialist services, such as pediatrics and mental health. Other responses indicated the need for increased community education.

#### Determination of Health Equity

Meade District Hospital recognizes that Health Equity is important in providing quality health care to the individuals and families we serve. It is important that the hospital better understand what health equity means to the residents of Meade County in order to better serve the community. Table 7 provides the responses received from the survey.

Representatives from hospital leadership, school affiliation, and the county health department met to evaluate the survey results and develop implementation strategies. The following concerns were identified, based on the results of the community survey:

- Mental Health in children and teenagers
- Mental Health in adults
- Primary Care Physician
- Obesity in adults
- Stress Management
- Vaping among teenagers

Through discussion, it was determined that mental health and obesity are continued strategies from the 2019 Community Health Needs Assessment. Stress management was established as an association with mental health, in addition to some of the other concerns that were identified throughout the survey, such as drug abuse, and lack of accessibility to physical fitness (gym). The group settled on the following needs as priority concern to focus on for the 2022 Community Health Needs Assessment.

- Mental Health needs from childhood to adult
- Primary Care Physician
- Obesity in adults
- Vaping among teenagers

#### **Community Health Needs Implementation Strategy**

The following is the list of concerns for the 2022 Community Health Needs Assessment and the action that the hospital and community plan to take to remedy the identified concerns.

- Mental Health Needs for Children, Teens, and Adults
  - The hospital will explore the implementation of a Zero Suicide Program within the hospital and community entities (schools, Sherriff's Office, Ministerial Alliance)
  - The hospital will collaborate with the Meade County Health Department in promoting Southwest Guidance Center presence within the community and the resources offered.
  - The hospital will explore telemedicine and outpatient clinic options for mental health specialists
  - The hospital will promote Employee Assistance Programs (EAP) with other community agencies to assist their own employees with resources.
- Primary Care Physician Meade District Hospital recognizes the need for the community to have an established physician within the primary service community.
  - The hospital will continue to attend recruiting events and career fairs.
  - The hospital will communicate and involve the primary service community in this important process.
  - The hospital will continue working with recruiting firms to find the 'right fit' for the rural health community we serve.
- Obesity in Adults The hospital recognizes that the strategies to combat obesity will also assist with some other health factors identified in the survey, such as Diabetes, heart disease, and stress management.
  - The hospital will collaborate with fitness centers, local gym, exercise studio, and yoga studio owners to promote services to the primary service community.
  - The hospital will collaborate with the Meade County Extension office to help promote community health programs.
  - The hospital will help screen patients for risk factors of obesity such as hypertension, diabetes, and heart disease at the annual health fair.
  - The hospital will use marketing strategies to help educate the community on obesity through social media.
- Vaping Among Teenagers
  - The hospital will explore collaborating with the schools on utilizing vaping censors in the bathrooms.
  - The hospital will collaborate with local entities to help provide educational resources to the community regarding vaping.
  - The hospital will provide education materials in exam rooms (i.e. posters, pamphlets, etc).
